

KERRY'S EXAMPLE

Here's how I would answer the 5 Questions using Dory's monologue from *Finding Nemo*. Feel free to write directly in your script (like I did below) if that helps you!

1. **Who are you?**

I'm Dory, a blue Tang Fish

2. **Who are you speaking to?**

I'm speaking to my friend Marlin, who is searching for his missing son, Nemo.

3. **What just happened?**

The first line of the monologue is "STOP!" so I've decided that what just happened is Marlin began to swim away. By saying "STOP!" I'm trying to get him to stay and listen to me.

4. **What do you want?**

I want to convince Marlin to stay with me and keep searching for Nemo.

5. **What are you feeling?**

Throughout this monologue I am feeling:

Panicked

Frightened

Frustrated

Desperate

Lonely

Soothed

Hopeful

Dory from Finding Nemo

After his son, Nemo, is captured by a scuba diver, Marlin attempts to find him. Along the way he meets with Dory, a fish who suffers from short-term memory loss. Dory has seen the address "P. Sherman 42 Wallaby Way" on a scuba mask left by the diver who captured Nemo. However, after believing that Nemo has died, Marlin abandons Dory. In this monologue, Dory attempts to get Marlin to stay.
